The Failure of Religion

In his book "Son of Hamas" Mosab Hassan Yousef tells his story of growing up as the son of a founder of Hamas (the Palestinian terrorist organization). As he grew up he saw Islam as a religion of piety and love for Allah. But as he became more involved with Muslim leaders, he realized that there was an incredible amount of duplicity amongst them. Religious leaders would call their people to take up arms against Israel and then leave them when the fighting started. They would often punish the weak and the poor simply because they had no family to take revenge for them. Over time Mosab began to realize that the piety that the religious people around him espoused was a farce. At the same time, he started reading the Bible, particularly the Gospels. As he learned more about Christ, he began to see that the way of Jesus was the only way to live in this world.

Those who see religion as the way to God but reject Christ are just as lost as the atheist. The religious may be even worse off because they do not think they have a need. The harshest words Jesus had were for the religious. Jesus exposed the problem with religion in Matthew 23:27-28, *"Woe to you, teachers of the law and Pharisees, you hypocrites! You are like whitewashed tombs, which look beautiful on the outside but on the inside are full of dead men's bones and everything unclean. In the same way, on the outside you appear to people as righteous, but on the inside you are full of hypocrisy and wickedness."* What an awful description of a person's state! This is an exhortation to us believers as well as the Christless religious people. We should not look to religion as our savior. At the essence of such a pursuit is a works-based faith that only ends in hypocrisy and deceit. The truth is we need to know Christ as our Lord and Savior. Religious exercises were never able to provide the forgiveness of God we so desperately need. Knowing Christ is our only hope from the empty cisterns of religious pursuits.

Dear Youth Parents,

Thank you to everyone who attended the recent youth parent meeting. We are grateful for your care and partnership in discipling our students.

Pastor Brett opened by reminding us of a core biblical principle: the primary responsibility for discipleship rests with parents. Youth ministry exists to support and equip families, not to replace discipleship in the home.

The purpose of the meeting was to communicate the direction of youth ministry moving forward and to answer questions. The current youth team includes Gavin Short, Hannah Short, Bailey Siewert, Vern Barnett, Chris Shook, Amber Shook, and Bethany Siegalkoff. Parents were invited to serve as helpers, group leaders, teachers (after vetting), and by signing up to provide snacks.

Several changes were shared. Wednesday night game time will shift toward fellowship-focused hangout time, with intentional games and space to connect. Youth Bucks Jobs will transition to Youth Jobs, where students are paid directly when applicable. Existing Youth Bucks may still be used for church activities.

Teaching will rotate among the current leaders using the Strong Students curriculum from Regular Baptist Press, beginning with the Wise Ways study through the book of Proverbs. Using a curriculum helps ensure doctrinal faithfulness and consistency while reducing the burden on volunteer teachers who balance full-time jobs, family responsibilities, and other ministries.

Summer camp plans are still being evaluated by the elders.

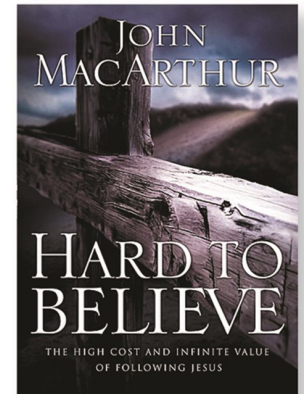
